

Featured Program

Healthy Transitions

Healthy Transitions, formally known as Transitional Age Youth (TAY), is one of the many programs at ALI that offers mental health support intertwined with supported education, supported employment, and assistance with learning life skills. Healthy Transitions focuses on the age range of 16-25 and assists these individuals with their transition from young adulthood into adulthood. The Healthy Transitions team is encompassed with two transition facilitators who help with educational goals and life skills such as budgeting and saving, an employment specialist who assists with finding and maintaining competitive employment within the community, an intake coordinator who completes intake assessments and treatment plans, an outreach and education specialist who educates the community on Healthy Transitions, and lastly the program director who makes sure that the mission and vision of Arundel Lodge are being applied in all facets within the program. The young adults also participate in monthly groups tailored toward mental health and team-building skills such as candle making, painting, and pottery. To be eligible for Healthy Transitions, the young adult must be in the specified age range, must be an Anne Arundel County resident, must have an educational and employment goal, and must be in or willing to engage in therapy.
