Rogers describes <u>ALI's Veterans Wellness Program</u> as a "community-based hub, a one-stop-shop. It's a bridge between two worlds - to community. A place where we know where we are and know where we're going. We can come here and catch our breath."

The Veterans Wellness Program at Arundel Lodge provides a holistic, person-centered approach to addressing the psychological, social, emotional, physical, and environmental needs of military veterans and their families. We understand their ultimate desire is to find a quality of life that embraces wellness — an empowering choice toward a healthy and fulfilling life.


volunteers who have tirelessly given their time and talent throughout the year!
