






ARUNDEL LODGE UPDATE



Arundel Lodge Receives \$50,000 Grant for Medication Assisted Treatment

The opioid crisis in America is a growing problem. In Anne Arundel County, the situation does not fare well.

The photo above, taken just outside of the police station in Edgewater on September 13, 2019, shows that in Anne Arundel County alone, 623 community members have overdosed on Heroin in 2019, and 102 of those people died as a result of an overdose. In March 2019, there were 119 members of the community who had overdosed, with 20 of them resulting in death, an increase of almost 20% in only six months.

Unfortunately, community members who experience opioid use disorders typically cannot simply stop using opioids abruptly, and it is not generally advisable to do so. Stopping "cold turkey," has a low incidence of recovery success (fewer than 25% remain in recovery for one year) due to intense cravings and withdrawal symptoms. Quitting abruptly can cause seizures, arrhythmia, hallucinations, and other life-threatening medical conditions. That being said, many individuals do overcome opioid addiction and live healthy, productive lives.

Thanks to a \$50,000 grant from the Chaney Impact Fund,

First Step Recovery Center at Arundel Lodge is expanding their medication assisted treatment (MAT) program.

DID YOU KNOW...

What is Harm Reduction?

In the most general terms, harm reduction refers to strategies or practices intended to reduce the potential negative consequences of a host of situations or activities. Seat belts in cars, fences around pools, bicycle helmets, and sunscreen are but a few examples.

Harm reduction gained widespread recognition in health care in the 1980's when syringe exchange programs and other social supports were conceived in response to the threat of the AIDS epidemic and the spread of infectious diseases such as HIV and hepatitis C. With a

focus on preventing the harm of drug use as opposed to preventing the drug use itself, these strategies faced strong resistance from the federal government. Over time, as research continually substantiated the program's effectiveness, recognition of the benefits began to overshadow the concerns, and today clean needle programs are legal in nearly forty states including Maryland.

As the United States faces an overdose epidemic that is claiming more lives in a year than those lost to HIV/AIDS, car accidents and gun violence combined, harm reduction strategies and the underlying principles are worthy of careful analysis. While there are varying perspectives on multiple fronts, opinions formed without an in-depth understanding can hamstring the collective response needed to tackle this public health crisis defining our time...


